A SCOUT'S JOURNEY

The Cub Scout Pack is made up of several dens for each grade level: Lions(K), Tigers(1st), Wolves(2nd), Bears(3rd), Webelos(4th), and Arrow of Light(5th).

The pack is led by the volunteer Cub Master during monthly pack meetings where Scouts have fun, fellowship, and are awarded badges, beltloops, and pins that are earned during the month. The Pack also plans campouts, community service, and other fun outings.

Dens are led by volunteer Den Leaders and Assistant Den Leaders, with Den Meetings typically held 1-2 times a month.




RANK ADVANCEMENT

Cub Scouts earn adventures that are specific to their grade and rank. A number of adventures must be completed to earn the badge of rank for each grade level. Adventures may be earned in any order. Completion of adventures is how the aims of character. citizenship, leadership, and personal fitness are developed.



HOW YOU CAN HELP

Pack 46 relies heavily on the involvement of parents to succeed. The most important contribution parents can make is to work with their children on their Cub Scouting adventures as they work toward their badge of rank. The Cub Scout handbook is full of age-appropriate activities; some of them you do together at home. Den meetings are designed for Cub Scouts to complete adventures that are required for them to earn their badge of rank. When you have completed a requirement at home, make sure your den leader is informed so that they can properly record it and your child can be recognized for their achievements.

Your role as a parent is the secret to a successful Cub Scouting program! Pack 46 operates through 100% volunteer leadership. Volunteer leaders are an example of Scouting's principle of service to others. We ask that every parent sign up to volunteer for at least one activity and/or committee during the Scouting year. In doing so, you will contribute to the success of the Pack and be a positive influence in the lives of your children and their friends. **Please visit Pack46.com/volunteer to select an area to contribute in**, or you may reach out to the Cub Master or Committee Chair if you are interested in helping.



YOUTH PROTECTION

Scouting America and Pack 46 take the safety of youth participants very seriously. All registered leaders are required to complete Scouting America Youth Protection Training, and EVERY adult must adhere to strict standards. While not required for non-registered adults, Pack 46 recommends that all parents complete youth protection training.

Some important guidelines to be aware of include:

- Parents or guardians of Lions and Tigers must be present with their children during all Cub Scout activities. Parents or guardians of all other Cub Scouts are encouraged at every activity.
- Two adults must always be present when leading youth (no 1on1 youth-adult contact is allowed except by parents and their own children).
- No child may enter any tent other than that of their own family.
- Bathroom facilities differ by venue, and there should be no cohabitation between male/female & youth/adults other than direct family members.
- While visitors are encouraged at many events, all adults staying overnight on a campout must be a legal parent/guardian of a scout, or a Registered Scouting Leader.



SCOUTING'S BARRIERS TO ABUSE

ADULT LEADERSHIP



Find a buddy: Always maintain 2-deep leadership on all outings, including meetings and any trips
Three or more: One-on-one contact between youth and adults is prohibited, including electronic communication

- 🕑 Be the teacher: Utilize constructive discipline
 - Be a guide: Youth leadership monitored by adults

RESPECT

Respect the privacy of everyone: Adults, youth and leaders
 Respect your peers: No secret organizations allowed
 Being mean isn't cool: Bullying and hazing are prohibited

Keep calm and camp on: Always have separate housing and restroom accommodations for adults and youth
Stay classy: Maintain appropriate attire
Stay safe: Always enforce Youth Protection policies and always use the buddy system

FAQ'S

How often are meetings? Pack meetings (all grades together) meet once a month at Westchase Elementary for awards and exciting activities. Dens (grade-specific groups) meet an additional 1-2 times per month to work on Adventures (fun & educational lessons on a wide range of skill sets).

How does my child earn awards? Scouts will work with their den to earn adventure awards every month. Scouts can also work on adventures at home. Pack 46 recognizes scouts at monthly pack meetings for awards earned. Your scout will likely earn AT LEAST one award each month in Cub Scouts.

Can siblings participate in campouts and activities? Yes! Cub Scouts is a family program so siblings and parents are welcome to attend meetings and activities. Everything we do is designed with the entire family in mind!

How often do you camp? We organize one Pack campout in the Fall and one in the Spring which are both covered in Pack dues. Our first campout is Spook-O-Ree, a Halloween-themed campout in October at Camp Brorein in Odessa! We also offer additional campouts throughout the year organized by Den Leaders or the Greater Tampa Bay Area Scout Council.

We're not really a "camping family." Well then you'll love our campouts! We design every campout as if everyone is a first-time camper, and the entire family is invited! Campouts are typically nearby, action-packed with age-appropriate activities, and you don't have to worry about cooking since the Pack 46 cook crew prepares the BEST food anywhere in the woods!

Does my child need a scout uniform? Not for the open house, but if you decide to join, every scout in Pack 46 is encouraged to wear the Scout uniform! Uniforms can be purchased at the local Scout store or on scoutshop.org. Your Den Leader will guide you on what to purchase.

My kids are in too many activities. What is the time commitment? Scouting is a program for all kids no matter their interests or hobbies. That's why scouts have become presidents, professional athletes, rocket scientists, CEOs, conservationists, and so many other difference makers as adults! We are a pack full of busy families so our activities are flexible, attendance is never mandatory, and adventure award requirements can be made up on your own time if meetings are missed.

Since when can girls join Cub Scouts? Since 2018. Well, sisters of boys have been participating in Cub Scouts for 100 years, but in 2018 they finally made it official that girls could sign up and earn awards just like the boys. We are co-ed Pack and our girls thrive on the adventure of Scouting!

What kind of service will my child participate in? Pack 46 emphasizes community service and you'll see our scouts serving throughout the community including at the Westchase Food Drive, Westchase Santa Parade, the American Legion, and anywhere else we can be helpful.

Who are the leaders? Pack 46 is led by a dedicated group of volunteer parents and leaders who are passionate about Scouting's impact in the lives of kids. Registered volunteer leaders are background-checked & trained to deliver the Scouting program, however all parents are encouraged to help in some way throughout the year.

How much does it cost? Pack 46 keeps costs as low as possible for scout families. First you'll pay a National Scouting fee of \$118 for a year's membership in the program, then you'll pay Pack 46 dues of \$125 per semester (Fall & Spring) which covers most activities. Additional costs to expect are a uniform and optional outings. We believe scouting is for every youth regardless of financial ability, so scholarships and fundraisers are available to offset the costs. What if my child is too old for Cub Scouts? Scouting America's program for middle and high schoolers is called ScoutsBSA where adventure is taken to a whole new level.
